<u>Recommendation 1:</u> Improve communication and interaction among Board members by working with a conflict management or mediation specialist and conduct a strategic assessment of the District to determine whether the existing mission, goals, bylaws and board member responsibilities are understood and remain relevant.

<u>Recommendation 2:</u> Organize Annual Work Plan to address high priority items with specific, measurable action items and monitor staff and Board delivery of programs and projects.

<u>Recommendation 3:</u> Develop a fiscal management agreement between Ramsey Conservation District and Ramsey County.

<u>Recommendation 4:</u> Develop orientation and continued education plan for the board and staff to provide for operational effectiveness of the District and Board members through education, succession of positions and outreach to partners.

<u>Recommendation 5</u>: Continue to build on the use of major or minor watershed scale in comprehensive plan by the use of Prioritized, Targeted and Measureable criteria in implementation of action items of the plan.

#### **Explanation of Fiscal/FTE Impact:**

BWSR has financial assistance available (up to \$15,000) to support the implementation of these recommendations, if the Board would choose to pursue these.

# SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN: THE COUNTY OF OLMSTED AND THE OLMSTED SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 31st day of December 2002, by and between the County of Olmsted (hereinafter "County"), a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, and the Olmsted Soil and Water Conservation District, governmental subdivision of the State of Minnesota (hereinafter "SWCD"), WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County is a duly organized and existing political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, and,

WHEREAS, SWCD is a Soil and Water Conservation District organized and operating in accordance with Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103C, and,

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are authorized and empowered by M.S. 375.18 and M.S. 103C.231 to enter into cooperative agreements for the purpose of the powers of each of the parties hereto, and,

WHEREAS, SWCD desires to concentrate its time, energy, and effort on the establishment of conservation practices and on stewardship promotion and conservation education, and,

WHEREAS, the County has, or will have, available the personnel, office space, and equipment necessary to provide all administrative, personnel, financial management, and other operational functions necessary to carry out the duties and programs of the SWCD;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. RECITALS: The recitals set forth in the whereas clauses are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 2. EMPLOYEES: That the SWCD employees the County deems as necessary, shall become employees of Olmsted County effective January 1, 2003 and will serve a one year probationary/evaluation

period before becoming regular employees of the County. The Public Works Department (hereinafter "Department") Director shall, in consultation with the SWCD, develop appropriate job descriptions, staffing plans, Department work plans, and operating policies to service SWCD programs. The County shall place said employees at the appropriate level on the County pay plan and at an agreed upon seniority level in accordance with applicable policies for non-contract employees. From the effective date, said employees shall, in all respects, be Olmsted County employees and shall be subject to all County administrative policies, rules, personnel policies, regulations, and pay plans. The County shall be responsible for insuring compliance with all such policies, regulations, and rules, including hiring – with input from the SWCD, discipline and discharge. The Department Director shall provide direction for the daily activities of said employees.

- 3. DUTIES OF COUNTY: That the County shall provide all necessary office space, equipment, supplies, and personnel necessary to administer and operate the programs and projects of the SWCD that are incorporated into the approved work plan. That the County shall retain ownership of all such equipment, supplies, and furniture acquired for the purpose of complying with this paragraph. The County shall provide all other office services such as telephone, copying, and similar services. The County shall serve as fiscal agent for the SWCD, maintain SWCD funds in segregated accounts, and produce financial summaries for SWCD review and state compliance purposes. The County retains its discretion to determine the level of funding it shall provide to the SWCD, or not, pursuant to Minn. Stat. 103C.331 subd. 16.
- 4. PAYROLL-RELATED TAXES: The county shall assume the responsibility for and shall pay all payroll deductions including, but not limited to, Social Security, Medicare, PERA, and other similar deductions, along with all income tax withholding requirements. The County shall also provide workers compensation insurance as required by law.
- 5. DUTIES OF SWCD: That the SWCD shall retain authority and shall be responsible for the development of soil and water conservation policy, input and adoption of the comprehensive and annual SWCD plans, entering into other agreements as recommended by staff to provide services and the approval, development, and management of conservation projects and all other powers generally enumerated in M.S. 103C.331 and M.S. 103G.2242, except as otherwise herein specifically designated and allocated to the County.

EQUIPMENT: All current and future equipment owned by the SWCD shall become property of the Department, but shall remain the available for use by the SWCD.

#### 7. BUDGET:

- a. Control of Project Funds: That SWCD shall encumber project funds and approve expenditures in accordance with the approved annual plan for conservation projects and practices including, by example, the receipt and disbursement of State grant funds, the receipt, disbursement and collection of loan funds, and any other funds specifically and directly related to a conservation practice. All funds received by or designated to the SWCD shall be promptly remitted to the County to be used to pay SWCD project or program costs and obligations of the SWCD
- b. Operating Budget: The SWCD shall review and develop with staff and recommend to the County Board an annual operating and program-related budget.
- 8. LIABILITY: Nothing in the agreement shall obligate or cause either party to incur any liability as the result of the actions of the other party as to any specific duty or responsibility assumed or retained hereunder. The County shall not incur any liability by reason of any action taken by SWCD under the authority retained under Paragraph 5. SWCD shall not incur any liability by reason of any action taken by the County under Paragraphs 2, 3, and 4. There is no obligation on the County to pay any obligation of the SWCD incurred prior to the effective date of this agreement.
- 9. EFFECTIVE DATE—CONTINUING EFFECT: This agreement shall be effective on January 1, 2003, and shall continue thereafter, from year to year, unless specifically terminated by either of the parties to this agreement.
- 10. TERMINATION: This agreement shall terminate with either party giving 90 days written notice to the other party of their desire to terminate the agreement.
- 11.AMENDMENTS: Any amendments, deletions, or waivers of the provisions of this agreement shall be valid only when reduced to writing and signed by the parties.

12. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This agreement shall constitute the entire agreement of the parties and shall supersede all oral agreements and negotiation between the parties relating to the subject matter herein.
