Family Home Visiting

- Is a strategy to address identified needs within a targeted population within the community
- Provided by Public Health Nurses
- Driven by disparities in:
 - Infant mortality
 - Birth outcomes
 - School readiness
 - Child maltreatment



What is Family Home Visiting?

- Family Home Visiting:
 - Is Voluntary.
 - Is provided in the family's home environment (mostly).
 - Is strength based
 - Ideally begins prenatally and continues through the early years of a child's life.
 - Provides parenting support and social, emotional, and health-related education/information to families.
 - Links families to appropriate community resources.







What is the Purpose?


Family home visiting services aim to:

- Be based on family strengths, needs and goals.
- Link pregnant women with prenatal care
- Support parents early in their role as a child's first teacher
- Ensure that very young children develop in safe and healthy environments
- Provide parenting support and education that decrease the risk of child abuse

Evidence Based Models

- Require adherence/fidelity to model elements
- Have oversite by outside of the organization
- Have on-going fees/costs
 - Affiliation or accreditation fees
 - Training fees
 - Consultation
 - Data collection and reporting



Evidence Based Models in Ramsey County

Healthy Families America (HFA)

- Families at risk for adverse childhood experiences, including child maltreatment
- Prenatally or within 3 months of birth through child's 3rd to 5th birthday

Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

- 1st time mothers
- <28 weeks gestation through child's 2nd birthday
- ROI of \$1 to \$5.70 (MN)


Evidence Informed Home Visiting

- Dependent on community needs and organizational capacity
 - Targeted
- Provided by public health nurses
- Prenatal, postpartum, early childhood home visits
- Generally short term (1-2 visits, maybe up to 1 year), dependent on family needs and organizational capacity

Family Home Visiting

- Historically provide about 20,000 visits/year to families
- Average a little over 100-120 referrals/month
- Serve approximately 1200 families/year
 - 400 are prenatal
