What are the benefits of being a returning JAN?



Final camp assignments will be sent to you by the middle of May (earlier if possible).

Good listeners
Like rules and logic
Prefer new tasks and experiences over reflection
Developing a more mature sense of right and wrong
May shrug off responsibility
Difficulty making decisions
Developing ideals and selecting role models
Good with teamwork, but can also be competitive

Capable of independent, critical ideas

Debate an environmental issue with peers
Go on a canoeing adventure
